CODE OF CONDUCT FOR CYCLISTS

Malvern Hills Conservators welcome cyclists on bridleways on the Hills and Commons under their jurisdiction.

To reduce conflict and to help you enjoy your day on the Hills we have produced this code.

1. We suggest you obtain an Ordnance Survey map that will show the position of the bridleways. These are the only tracks that legally you have a right to use.
2. Please keep to the bridleways to conserve this nationally important wildlife site (a Site of Special Scientific Interest). Please do not cycle on the ridge of the hills or other grass paths and particularly avoid skidding
3. Always give way to walkers and horse riders.
4. Slow down at corners and when cycling downhill. Other visitors often do not hear cyclists coming, and this can lead to accidents.

5. If riding with mends, avoid bunching, which can appear threatening to walkers and horse riders.
6. The Hills can get very busy at weekends and bank holidays. You will enjoy your ride more by cycling outside the busiest periods.

Through responsible cycling you can help to protect the Malvern Hills landscape and its wildlife for future generations.
